Champagne, Duane, ed. *The Native North American Almanac: A Reference Work on Native North Americans in the United States and Canada*. Gale Research, Inc., 2001. ISBN 0-7876-1655-9.

This almanac provides historical and contemporary facts about Native Peoples of North America, including information about culture, art, communities, life and legal relations. High School and up.

Davis, Mary B., ed. *Native America in the Twentieth Century: An Encyclopedia*. Garland Publishing, Inc., 1994. ISBN 0-8240-4846-6.

This one-volume encyclopedia focuses on the lives and cultures of Native Americans living in the Americas today. High School and up.

Francis, Lee. *Native Time: A Historical Time Line of Native America*. St. Martin's Press, 1996. ISBN 0-3121-3129-1.

Beginning in the year 200,000 B.C., this time line runs to the present day, illuminating the rich history, literature, art, heroes, legends, wisdom and philosophy of North American Native Peoples. High School and up.

Hirschfelder, Arlene and Martha Kriepe de Montaña. *The Native American Almanac: A Portrait of Native America Today*. Macmillan, 1993. ISBN 0-671-85012-1.

A one-volume almanac of information on Native Peoples. Each chapter addresses a topic in Native American history or culture, or a current issue affecting Native Peoples' lives today. Middle school and up.

Hoxie, Frederick E., ed. *Encyclopedia of North American Indians: Native American History, Culture and Life from Paleo-Indians to the Present*. Houghton Mifflin, 1996. ISBN 0-3956-6921-9.

Written by more than 260 contemporary authorities, this one-volume encyclopedia features many Native American contributors who offer a deeper and more informed appreciation of American Indian life, past and present. High School and up.

Malinowski, Sharon & Anna Sheets, eds. *The Gale Encyclopedia of Native American Tribes*. Gale Research, Inc., 1998. ISBN 0-7876-1085-2.

This four-volume set presents historical, cultural and current information on nearly 400 Native groups within 13 geographic regions. High School and up.

Malinowski, Sharon, Anna Sheets & Linda Schmittroth, eds. *UXL Encyclopedia of Native American Tribes*. Gale Research, Inc., 1999. ISBN 0-7876-2838-7.

This four-volume set contains 80 in-depth entries on tribal nations arranged by geographic area. Each entry contains information on history, government, daily life, arts, current issues and more. Middle School and up.

Sturtevant, William C., ed. *Handbook of North American Indians*. Smithsonian Institution, 1978.

A multi-volume set which gives an encyclopedic summary of the prehistory, history and cultures of the Native Peoples of North America. Volume 15 focuses on the Northeast region. Adult.

Waldman, Carl. *Encyclopedia of Native American Tribes*. Facts on File, Inc., Third Edition, 2006. ISBN 0-8160-6274-9.

A one-volume comprehensive reference work discussing more than 150 tribal nations of North America. Organized alphabetically by tribal nation or group, the text summarizes the historical record and includes present day tribal affairs. Middle School and up.
